

Village of Rossville
Police, Health & Safety Committee Meeting
April 20, 2026
6:00 p.m.

A quorum was established as Chairman Wallace and Trustees Mikel and Gammon were physically present at the committee meeting held at the Rossville Municipal Building, located at 120 East Attica Street in Rossville, Illinois. The guests present were Mayor Black, Clerk White and Kenneth Gammon. Chief Greene attended the meeting electronically.

Chairman Wallace called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The purpose of the meeting was to review/approve past minutes, review outstanding ordinance violations, the prior month's police actions, monthly ordinance spreadsheet, review maintenance log sheets on police vehicles, property at 214 E. Attica follow up, discuss Flock group amendment, police applicants, proposed nuisances to be added to the ordinance book for PNTs and review proposed police budget.

Minutes of the January 19, 2026 committee meeting – Minutes of the meeting held on January 19, 2026, were presented. Motion was made by Mikel, seconded by Gammon to dispense with the reading of the minutes and approve the minutes as presented. Vote: Mikel, yes; Gammon, yes; Wallace, yes.

Prior Month's Policing Activity – Chief Greene read her Police Chief's report.

Add Nuisances to the Added to the Ordinance Book for PNTs – Chief Greene attached a list of nuisances that need to be added to the PNT section. Chairman Wallace will contact the attorney and review the requested nuisances for approval then present to the committee and Village Board for approval and passage.

Monthly ordinance and maintenance log sheets – There were no comments on the ordinance and maintenance log sheets.

Old Business – Mayor Black reported he spoke with the Village Attorney regarding 214 E. Attica, who is reissuing warrants and going through the process again since changing attorneys.

There were no successful police applications.

New Business – The proposed police budget was reviewed. Several line items were increased this year such as IACP fees, utilities, PSF fees, car repair and obtain 1 Verkada camera, which is a solar camera, 5G cell based, facial recognition and can be placed on a pole. The extra cameras were removed from the budget and use the Fleet camera line item instead.

Motion was made by Gammon, seconded by Wallace to adjourn the meeting. Vote: Mikel, yes; Gammon, yes; Wallace, yes. The meeting was adjourned at 6:21 p.m.
